ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- U. S. Citizen / Naturalized Citizen
- 17-23 years of age
- Minimum Test Scores: ACT: 22 or ASVAB: 74 or SAT: 1000
- Pass USMC Physical Fitness Test
- No criminal record or serious civilian offenses
- Admittance to a participating NROTC College or university
- No excessive tattoos (waiver required)
- High School Seniors are eligible to apply for the 4 Year NROTC Scholarship

BOARD SUBMISSION TIMELINES

EARLY BOARD SUBMISSION:

31 October, 2022: Applications due
Mid December 2022: Results are released

REGULAR BOARD SUBMISSION:

31 January, 2023: Applications due
1 April 2023: Results are released

- Apply to eligible NROTC colleges or universities (local examples: Univ of Minnesota, Univ of Wisconsin, Univ of Iowa, St Thomas Univ)
- Online (NETFOCUS) application deadline **31 January 2023**, APPLY EARLY; be considered for Early board (deadline **31 October, 2022**)
